FAQ for bigKIDS Camp

1. How will my child get there?

Children attending CentriKid will travel to and from the church's Antioch campus by Charter bus. Drop-off will be Monday July 18th at noon. Food will *not* be provided. Please feed your child beforehand. The bus will depart for Bolivar by 12:45pm. Please do not leave before checking-in. There may be forms we need you to sign before your child can go.

Pick-up will be at the Antioch campus on Friday July 22^{nd} . We'll leave Bolivar around 11:00am. Snacks will be provided for your child on the way home. We expect to arrive at the church between 1:00 - 1:30.

2. What if my child takes medicine?

If your child takes medicine, we require *all prescribed medicine and all over-the-counter allergy medicine to be given to Aim or Kevin*. This so we can make sure medicine is safe, doesn't get lost or stolen, and it allows us to track when your child has taken medicine. Trained adult leaders will oversee medicine and will administer it to your child throughout the week. Medicine will be given back to you when we arrive at church on Friday. Please do not give us OTC medicine like Tylenol, Advil, or ibuprofen. Adults will have those on them.

Medicine should be in the prescribed bottle with your child's name on it. Do not put loose pills in a bag. Please only send the amount needed for the week.

3. Where will my child sleep?

Children and adult leaders will stay in suite-style dorms on campus at SBU. The beds are twin size, so please pack twin-size sheets or a sleeping bag and a pillow.

4. How many adults will be at camp?

Lifeway requires a ratio of 1 adult to every 5 children. Lifeway also staffs their camp with trained adult leaders.

5. What if my child has food allergies?

Please let us know if your child has any food allergies so we can make the food service team aware.

6. What does a typical day at camp look like?

7. Can my child bring his or her phone? How will I contact my child?

No, we do not allow children to bring any kind of electronic device to camp. This is to allow them to unplug from distractions and focus on God and fellowship. Adult leaders will all always have their phones with them. Leader's cell phones are available for phone calls home. Feel free to call Aim or Kevin at any time to reach your child.

8. Does my child need to bring money?

No, your child does not <u>need</u> to bring money. Meals are all covered under the registration cost. However, if your child wants merchandise, to visit the \$1 snow cone stand, or get a snack, they are welcome to do so.

Merchandise varies depending on the item. Shirts are \$10-15, sweatshirts are \$25-30 and there's smaller stuff for around \$1

9. Can my child bring snacks to camp?

Yes! Try to avoid stuff that can melt or makes a sticky mess.

10. Can I visit?

We would love to have you come with us as an adult leader. If you can't please use your best judgment when coming to visit. If your child can't handle a visit, and will want to leave camp early, we ask that you not visit.

11. Can I send mail to my child?

Yes! Put your letters, cards, or care packages in the mail the week before camp. Sometimes the mail can be backed up, so this ensures it gets to your child while we're there.
